

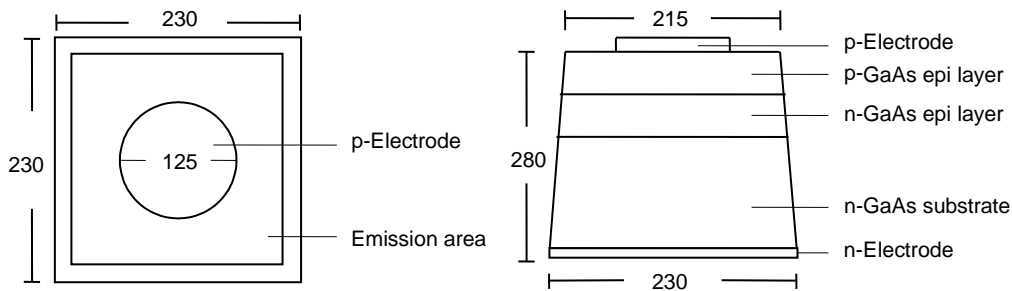
### ■ Features :

Fig 1. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

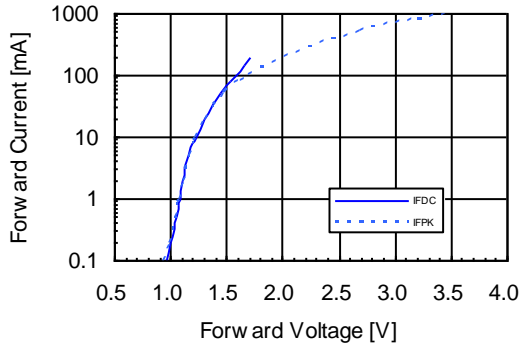


Fig 2. Relative Radiant Power vs. Wavelength

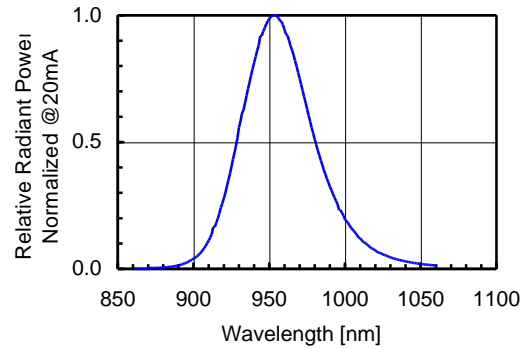


Fig 3. Relative Radiant Power vs. Forward DC Current

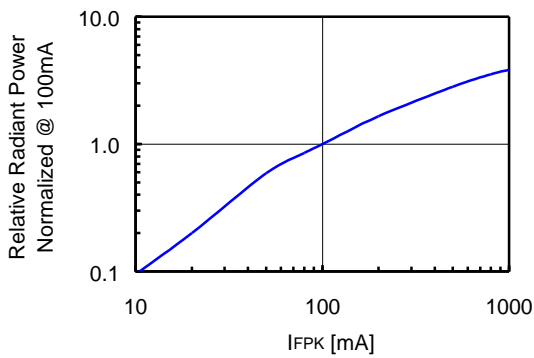


Fig 4. Relative Radiant Power vs. Forward Peak Current

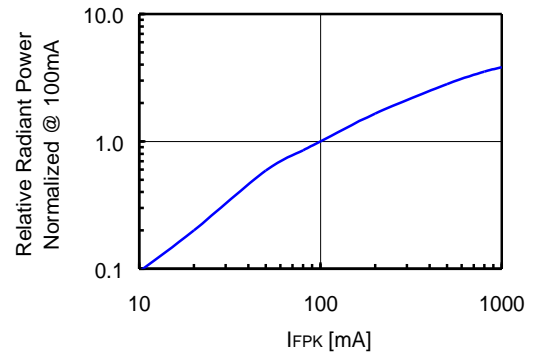


Fig 5. Forward DC Voltage vs. Temperature

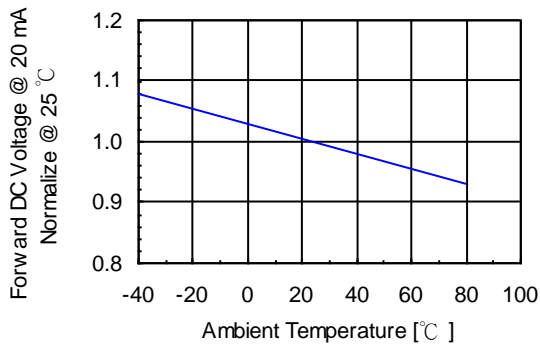


Fig 6. Relative Radiant Power vs. Temperature
